



Re: MacCurtain Street Public Transport Improvement Scheme

Location: Bridge St & St. Patrick's Hill Re-Surfacing.

Start Date: Monday 18th September 2023

Dear Resident/Trader,

Cork City Council is carrying out a Pedestrian & Traffic Improvement Scheme in your area. This includes footpath enhancement and road re-surfacing works to enhance pedestrian safety in the area. McGinty & O'Shea Limited are working on behalf of Cork City Council to deliver this project.

Road Re-Surfacing works are scheduled to commence on Bridge St & St. Patrick's Hill up to the Junction of Hardwick St from Monday 18th September between the hours of 9:30am & 4:30pm daily. This will require short term staggered road closures over a period of four days as detailed below.

Traffic Management:

Monday 18th **Sept.:** Coburg St westbound & St. Patrick's Hill (lower section) **Closed**. No access from Bridge St between 9:30am & 4:30pm. Access to MacCurtain St will be maintained.

Tuesday 19th Sept. MacCurtain St **Closed**. No access from Bridge St between 9:30am & 4:30pm. Access to Coburg St & St. Patrick's Hill will be maintained.

Wednesday 20th Sept.: Coburg St westbound & St. Patrick's Hill (Lower Section) **Closed**. No access from Bridge St between 9:30am & 4:30pm. Access to MacCurtain St will be maintained.

Thursday 21st Sept. MacCurtain St **Closed**. No Access from Bridge St between 9:30am & 4:30pm. Access to Coburg St & St. Patrick's Hill will be maintained.

Motorists are asked to follow the diversion route in place. Pedestrians are asked to use the pedestrian routes provided.

Parking: Parking on the lower section of St. Patrick's Hill between MacCurtain St & Hardwick St will be suspended for the duration of the works.

We request that if you have any deliveries scheduled during this period that if possible, you would arrange for these to be undertaken outside these hours.

Note: The proposed works are weather dependant and may be subject to change.
